Eligibility Criteria ¹	Does not meet criteria
Abstract is submitted by WSU Pullman fee-paying graduate and professional students.	
All work must have been completed at or for WSU (no external student internships).	
Only one abstract per primary or presenting author.	
Abstract meets the 250-word limit.	
Abstract demonstrates scientific, scholarly, or creative significance.	

¹The abstracts go through an initial screening for eligibility in most (but not all) of the above categories. However, the reviewer may discover things that have been missed in the initial screening. If any of the above boxes are checked) then the abstract should be marked as “ineligible.”

Implications/Contribution	Abstract communicates how research is clear, substantial, novel, current, or cutting-edge in participant's field and/or beyond.	Work highlights a limited impact in presenter's field and/or community, but is still relevant.	Impact of work is unclear, loosely related to the field, not completely current, or poorly presented.	The original contribution or appropriateness to the field is not presented or loosely justified.	
Communication to the General Audience²	Well understandable even for people from different fields of the present study.	Understandable but is not written appropriately to use minimum technical terms.
